IV. COMPOSITION OF COUNTRY GROUPS

The Czech Republic, Hungary, Korea , Poland and the Slovak Republic are included in the totals for “Total OECD” group from 1995 onwards.

Euro area: Austria, Belgium, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Ireland, Italy, Luxembourg, the Netherlands, Portugal, Spain.

EU15: All euro area countries plus Denmark, Sweden, the United Kingdom.

North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA): Canada, Mexico, the United States.

Total OECD: EU15 plus Iceland, Norway, Switzerland, Turkey, Canada, Mexico, the United States, Japan, Australia and New Zealand, and from 1995 the Czech Republic, Hungary, Korea, Poland, the Slovak Republic.

Organisation of Petroleum Exporting Countries (OPEC): Algeria, Libya, Nigeria, Venezuela, Iraq, Saudi Arabia, Kuwait, United Arab Emirates, Qatar, Iran, Indonesia.

Association of South East Asian Nations (ASEAN): Brunei Darussalam, Indonesia, Lao People’s Democratic Republic, Malaysia, Myanmar, Philippines, Singapore, Thailand, Viet Nam.

Asian Dynamic Economies (ADE): China, Hong Kong (China), Chinese Taipei.

Central and Eastern European Countries (CEEC): Albania, Bulgaria, Estonia, Latvia, Lithuania, Romania, Republic of Slovenia.

Commonwealth of Independent States (CIS): Armenia, Azerbaijan, Belarus, Georgia, Kazakstan, Kyrgyz Republic, Republic of Moldova, Russian Federation, Tajikistan, Turkmenistan, Ukraine, Uzbekistan.

Southern cone common market (MERCOSUR): Argentina, Brazil, Paraguay, Uruguay, with Chile as associate member.

Andean Pact (ANDEAN): Bolivia, Colombia, Ecuador, Peru, Venezuela.
